SERIES BIG IDEA

BIG IDEA

This Christmas, let us conspire to Worship Fully and not miss the God who is with us.

SCRIPTURE

Luke 1:46-55 (Mary's Song)

Mary said, "My soul gives glory to the Lord. My spirit delights in God my Savior. He has taken note of me even though I am not considered important. From now on all people will call me blessed. The Mighty One has done great things for me. His name is holy. He shows his mercy to those who have respect for him, from parent to child down through the years. He has done mighty things with his powerful arm. He has scattered those who are proud in their deepest thoughts. He has brought down rulers from their thrones. But he has lifted up people who are not considered important. He has filled with good things those who are hungry. But he has sent away empty those who are rich. He has helped the people of Israel, who serve him. He has always remembered to be kind to Abraham and his children down through the years. He has done it just as he promised to our people of long ago."

Luke 2:8-20 (Shepherds)

There were shepherds living out in the fields nearby. It was night, and they were taking care of their sheep. An angel of the Lord appeared to them. And the glory of the Lord shone around them. They were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news. It will bring great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you. He is the Messiah, the Lord. Here is how you will know I am telling you the truth. You will find a baby wrapped in strips of cloth and lying in a manger." Suddenly a large group of angels from heaven also appeared. They were praising God. They said, "May glory be given to God in the highest heaven! And may peace be given to those he is pleased with on earth!" The angels left and went into heaven. Then the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem. Let's see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph and the baby. The baby was lying in the manger. After the shepherds had seen him, they told everyone. They reported what the angel had said about this child. All who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary kept all these things like a secret treasure in her heart. She thought about them over and over. The shepherds returned. They gave glory and praise to God. Everything they had seen and heard was just as they had been told.

ICEBREAKER

MESSAGE BIG IDEA

SCRIPTURE

Luke 1:46-55 (Mary's Song) & Luke 2:8-20 (Shepherds)

(Make sure you have extra resources for group members who don't have a Bible or Bible app on their phones. Or, copy and print the scripture onto single sheets to pass out.)

ICEBREAKER

What's your favorite Christmas memory?

(This can be as deep or as heavy as you like.)

BIBLE DISCUSSION

1. Read Luke 1:46-55 and Luke 2:8-20— What struck you about Mary's song? What struck you about the shepherds' story?
(See if you can get two volunteers to read each of the two stories so that four group members will have read. Sometimes it helps if you tell them what the question will be ahead of time so that those who like to process can have time to think as the stories are read. If you want, read each story separately and discuss.)

LIFE APPLICATION QUESTIONS

2. Have you ever known someone who even in the midst of hard situations still chooses to worship?
3. What are the busy, busy things that keep you from worshipping fully?
4. What are the pressures you feel to embrace the consumerist, individualistic world rather than our true Kingdom of God?

NEXT STEPS/CHALLENGES FOR THIS WEEK

5. What steps do you need to take this Advent to make sure you are worshipping FULLY and not worshipping LASTLY?
