**THANK** God for the people in your life who you can trust to lead.


DAY 4

**BOTTOM LINE:** Trust and obey, even when you think your way is better. Read Luke 11:28

DAY 1

## Simon Says

God asks us to trust and obey Him in what we say and do. Play "Simon Says" with your family, which is a game that will help you to practice obeying.

Here is how to play: One person is designated Simon, the others are the players. Simon will stand in front of the group telling players what they must do. The players must only obey commands that begin with the words "Simon Says." If Simon says, "Simon says touch your nose," then players must touch their nose. But, if Simon simply says, "clap," without first saying "Simon says," players must not clap. Those that do clap are out. Keep playing with different commands from Simon.

**KNOW** that when you trust and obey God it will always be the best choice.

DAY 2

## Obey the Motions

Use the following motions to help yourself remember this week's Bible verse: **Luke 11:28!**

"He replies, Instead, blessed  
(hands raised above your head)

are those who hear

**ASK** God to help you remember to listen and obey His word, even when you think your way is better.

## Trusty Drawing

Grab some paper, something to draw with, and someone to help you! Your job is to draw whatever the person tells you draw, with your eyes closed! Although you might think keeping your eyes open is the better way, try your best to trust the other person to lead you! The person helping you is going to read the following directions to you! No peeking ahead!

**Drawing directions:** Draw a square. On top of the square draw a triangle. Inside of the square draw a rectangle. Now open your eyes! Guess what you drew.

**LOOK** for ways that you can trust others even when you think your way is better.



DAY 1

For each rainbow line you draw, write a place (example: at home, at school, at church, or at a friend's house) where you can obey and trust God. So if you draw your rainbow with six lines, write six places you can trust and obey God.

P.S. If you wanted to draw a traditional rainbow, you can make a rainbow using: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and purple!

**ASK** God to help you trust and obey Him wherever you are.

DAY 4


## Trust Here and There

DAY 1

## Wherever You Go

With the help of an adult, look up this week's Bible verse: **Joshua 1:9**. Read through the verse together. Talk together about what some of these phrases mean.

**Adults:** Ask your kids some of the following questions to help extend their understanding of the verse: What does it mean to be strong and brave? How can you show that you are strong and brave even when it's hard? What can you do when you feel like you might lose hope or when you want to give up? Do you believe God is with you wherever you go? Why?

**ASK** God to help you be strong, brave, and hopeful, even when it's hard.

DAY 3

## Make It Work

Grab some paper, something to draw with, and a timer. Set your timer for 30 seconds. Once you hit start on the timer, start scribbling or drawing circles all over your paper until the timer goes off. Once the timer stops, look at your drawing and see if you can make something out of the scribbles. Could you add some more lines or color some of the lines a different color to create something new? Maybe even add another drawing to complete your piece. How did it go? Whether you were able to create something new or not, that's okay!

Just like Abram, we don't always know how things are going to work out, but sometimes we just do them anyway. If we trust God in everything, He will take care of us no matter how it ends up.

**LOOK** for ways to be content, no matter what happens.

DAY 4

## Dizzy Prayer

Sometimes God tells us to do something and it doesn't make sense. Say a simple prayer to God, while closing your eyes and spinning around in a circle. See where you end up when you open your eyes.

**Pray something like this:** "Dear God, please show me how to trust You no matter where I go. Amen."

**THANK** God for being someone who is always with you no matter where you go or what you do.
