

BIG IDEA

Seeing like a Hero Maker requires a shift from focusing on my abilities and gifts to envisioning what God could do through the lives of others.

SCRIPTURE

Matthew 4:18-20, Luke 10:1-17, John 14:12-14, John 20:21

TIPS FOR DISCUSSION

1. When we talk about an ICNU conversation, we mean speaking out loud to another person this basic statement, "I see in you the ability to . . ."
2. People often don't see potential in themselves, and when we speak to their potential, it is an incredible gift to them.
3. When we look at the life and ministry of Jesus, he built relational equity with his disciples, and he was able to speak regularly into their lives and even challenge them when they were off base. It's challenging to do that if people don't trust you.
4. Be liberal with your ICNU. This means that you point out what you see in other people. If someone does a great job leading a meeting or coaching a team or helping a friend point it out to them. This practice will make you a little vulnerable because we often see people excel at things where we may be lacking talent, but you have to work through that if we want to be hero makers.
