1

Hard Times, Tough People

Now, you get to use what you learned to help others. What is something you have learned that could help someone else? It could be riding a bike, reading, or drawing. Grab some paper to either draw a picture or write about something you could do for someone that could use your help!

Praying Hard

Sometimes we can be so overwhelmed about what is going on around us that we don't know what to do! The best thing we can do is talk to someone who is always there: God! You can be confident that He will always be there to listen, no matter where you are. Let's take some time to talk to Him now.

“Dear God, Thank You for always being there for me no matter what, where, or when. I know that I can always trust You. I am confident that You will always hear me and love me forever. Amen.”

Be Confident in the Word

Ask a parent to help you look up Jeremiah 17:7. Read it together a few times. Now, talk together about ways that you can trust God. Parents, talk to you kids about a time that you trusted God and He took care of you!

Look for opportunities to put your trust in God when you can't do it alone!

Ah, Success!

Grab an adult and look up Jeremiah 29:11. Read it together a few times. Now, look for the word "success" or "prosper" within the verse. With a parent, ask these questions: What have you done in your life that has been a success? What is something at which you want to succeed? Imagine all you can do if you make God part of your plan!

Think about something you want to do that you could ask God to help you with.
